General Statement of the School's Admissions Criteria

At Running Deer ('the School') we have the space for young people with Special Educational Needs to express themselves without the confines of a classroom environment. Nature is one of our biggest therapeutic tools and Butterdon Wood is perfect for young people to learn, develop and participate in activities, even if they do not engage with nature directly.

Working closely with professionals and schools we can provide an individually tailored programme for young people aged 8 years and onwards with Special Educational Needs that may be part of a reduced timetable, or to support them whilst they transition into a new school.

Referrals are accepted on a part-time basis from other schools, subject to a trial period to ensure suitability for all parties..

Parents or guardians with prospective pupils are encouraged to visit the School to assist their decision-making process. Personal visits can be arranged by appointment for information and to view facilities.

The School will require information of any disability or special education needs which may affect a child's ability to participate in the admissions procedure and take full advantage of the education provided at the School, so that the School can assess those needs and consult with parents about the adjustments which can reasonably be made to ensure that the application procedure is accessible for the candidate and that the School can cater adequately for the pupil should the offer of a place be made.
